Companions of the Order of the Pelican (or 'Pelicans') have been recognized by the Crown for their exemplary service to the Kingdom and/or the Society, along with their consistent display of the virtues of Grace, Courtesy and Chivalric Demeanor. Their elevation is accompanied by a Patent of Arms (the highest level of arms)

What is an SCA Award?

Within The Society we have a formal system for recognising the achievements and contributions that individuals make to their various Baronies and to their Kingdom.

These awards are bestowed at the hands of the Crown and Their local representatives to recognise excellence in arts and sciences, martial pursuits and services to the various groups and Kingdoms. The awards themselves vary from Kingdom to Kingdom, Principality to Principality, and Barony to Barony. Within the Barony of Stomrhold and the Kingdom of Lochac, there are a multitude of awards bestowed upon individuals for different occasions and reasons, each with their own level of prestige. Below is a quick reference for the Awards within Lochac:

Awards of the Kingdom of Lochac

Lord and Lady are titles given to those that have Received an Award of Arms (often shortened to AoA), which is often the first award you may Receive.

Master and Mistress are titles that come with receiving the highest class of awards within the SCA, the peerages. of which there are peerages awarded for Arts and Sciences (Order of Laurels), Service to the Society (Order of the Pelican), Armoured combat (Order of Chivalry) and Rapier combat (Order of Defence). Royalty is also considered a peer, but Receive their own titles.

Baron and Baroness are titles given to two different groups. "landed" Barons and Baronesses are those that are the ceremonial leaders of a Barony. The crown also directly gives the title of "court" baron or baroness to those who make a unique or significant contribution to the kingdom. Both landed and court Barons and Baronesses are addressed as "your excellency" and wear a coronet.

Count and Countess are titles awarded to ex-royals after the conclusion of their first rein and at this point, they are considered "Royal Peers". The winner of the crown tourney wears a coronet and is addressed as "your Excellency". The other becomes a member of "the Order of the Rose", wears a coronet and is also addressed as "your Excellency"

The titles 'duke' and 'duchess' are granted to an ex-king or queen after their second reign. Dukes/duchesses are addressed as 'your Grace' and wear a coronet decorated with strawberry leaves.

There are also many awards given that have no titles attached to them

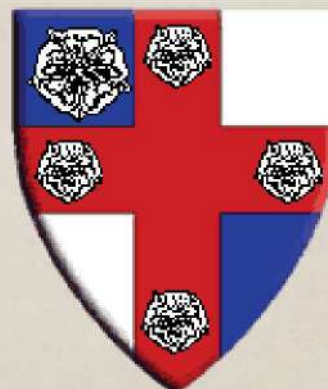

Baronial Awards

Baronial awards are awards that belong to a specific Barony, and are a symbol of the Barony's recognition and gratitude for the members within said Barony, that contribute significantly to the Barony or wider SCA society.



Baronial commendation

The pendant of the Drakkar sailing in a white metal sea is the token given to those who accomplish a worthy deed in service to the Barony.

Drakkar Awards:

The Drakkar is the symbol of stormhold, as such, all the Drakkar awards signify a level of service to the Barony that showcases the values that the Barony holds in high esteem.



The Silver Drakkar:
Given to those that show exceptional service to the Barony, by word and deed. The token is a drakkar affronty, as depicted on the Baronial arms, in the form of a silver pendant.



Gold Drakkar
This award is given to those who showcase exceptionally gracious behaviour which embodies the spirit of Stormhold and the spirit of the SCA. The token is a drakkar affronty as a gold pendant.



Gallant Drakkar
This award is given to members of the society who dwell beyond Stormhold's borders, but they have greatly aided the Barony from their efforts.



Drakkar's Sweep
Given for behind-the-scenes work and cleaning up after events. The token is a favour of white cloth with a drakkar embroidered upon it with white thread.



Storm lantern
This award is given for sharing knowledge and lighting the way to understanding.



Order of Svalinn

This award is Given for aiding in the defence of the Barony; by prowess locally and afar, by training or by supplying the warriors of Stormhold. The token is a coin depicting a Norse warrior head with helmet and the Latin text "Pro Bellator" (translation: "For the Fighter") on the front, and a drakkar in profile with the text "Stormhold" on the reverse.



Goutte de Pearl
This award is given for excellence in the Arts and Sciences.

Unique Awards and Baronial Gifts

Hood of Warmth

Given as a gift from the Baron and Baroness to newcomers, close to their second event attended in the Barony. The gift symbolises the warmth of the Barony's welcome, and can also form the beginnings of a collection of personal garb.

The tradition was instituted by Baron Rodrigo and Baroness Sara.

Baron's Coin and Baroness' Bead

Given to those the B&B felt were deserving of recognition, especially for service to their noble selves.

The Baronial cyphers for the reign of Baron Hanbal and Baroness Ute.



Golden Stars

Given to those the B&B felt were deserving of recognition, especially for service to their noble selves.

The Baronial cypher for the reign of Baron Hugh and Baroness Therasa.



Heart of the Barony

Given to those the B&B felt were deserving of recognition, especially for service to their noble selves.

The Baronial cypher for the reign of Baron Alaine and Baroness Lucrezia.

Tangling Drakkar

This tiny token was given Baron Sven and Baroness Ingibjorg to those who supported, or fought for, the barony in the Stormhold v. The Known Worlde War at Rowany Festival, AS XXVIII (1994).





Writing a Recommendation

Writing a recommendation can be done from any member of the SCA, regardless if you have no title or if you're a long standing peer. If you notice anyone within the Barony or the society at large, who you think deserves to be recognised, you need only write a letter of recommendation to the appropriate authority (most often the Baron/Baronesse or their Royal Majesties. You can enquire with your local herald or Baron/Baroness about which is most appropriate based on the award you're recommending that someone receive).

Thank you to the Honourable Maîtresse Sabine du Bourbonnais for constructing this letter template which is available along with a great many other SCA resources [here](#). Note this is most appropriate for Lochac/SCA awards, not baronial awards, in which case you should write to their excellencies.

Unto Their Royal Majesties, the Most Gracious {insert King's name} and {Queen's name}, of the fair Kingdom of {insert Kingdom name}, does your affectionate servant {insert your name}, send warmest Greetings.

I am writing to You this day, to bring to Your attention, a member of Your populace whom I believe is most deserving of recognition from the Crown for their exceptional {works of service/proficiency in the arts and sciences/prowess of the field etc.,}.

Be sure to include the personal qualities that you feel the individual possess that enrich the Society as well}.
